Caledon Soccer Competitive Program is committed to providing players with access to competitive youth soccer opportunities through a holistic player development program at the U13-U21 Age Groups. The Clubs Competitive Program consists of teams participating in both Regional and District levels where they compete against other Clubs from the Peel Halton and surrounding areas. Competitive teams play in both Indoor and Outdoor competitions and train three to four times per week throughout the year.

Competitive Coach 2005 Girls Regional Team:

The responsibility of this role will be to Coach the Caledon 2005 Girls and to assist the Club Head Coach in the ongoing implementation of Caledon Soccer Club Curriculum in accordance with Canada Soccer Long Term Player Development model. This position will oversee all aspects of team operations including training, games, and player tracking. This position will typically consist of eight (8) hours on-field per week. Evening and weekend work is expected.

Primary Duties and Responsibilities:

Team

- Coach the 2005 Girls Team
- Report progress of team to the Club Head Coach;
- Ensure accurate records are maintained to track development of all players on the 2005 Girls Team
- Liaise with Club's Goal Keeping Coach regarding the development of the teams Goal Keepers
- Attend three to four tournaments or showcase events per year - at the discretion of Club Head Coach
- Provide high level training for the 2005 Girls team that includes 3 to 4 training sessions per week and 1 game per week (a number of these games will be away matches requiring travel to Peel Halton);
- Utilize coaching resources and software to help plan and manage training sessions and game-play;
- Establish a periodized season plan for the team in keeping with club requirements;
- Conduct match preparation meetings and analysis with the team;
- Provide written player assessments a minimum of 2 times per season;

Club

- Participate in all in-house coach development sessions relating to the Talented Pathway
- Attend meetings and events (often in Peel Halton), as required;
- Participate in all in-house coach development sessions relating to the Clubs Competitive Program
- Support the Club Head Coach with parent engagement strategies to improve awareness of the Caledon Player Pathway.
